The dirty games of the EU, NATO, and WHO that the Swiss don't know about. I reject Jans, Pfister, and Ritter

I am an entrepreneur with over thirty years of experience, including in the defense sector, a former single father of three children from an intercultural marriage. I have always managed crises of various kinds, making decisions under pressure through leadership, staying true to my ideas. That's why I don't like half measures and am more convinced than ever that, in politics as in life, strong, bold decisions are needed that break out of the mold, defying conservative and common thinking out of fear of losing support. That's why my candidacy for the Federal Council as an independent is a logical consequence of who I am and what I believe. The Swiss, kept in the dark about many power plays by NATO, the EU, and the WHO, are about to become unconscious pawns in bigger projects than they are.

In a crucial area I know well, like defense, where less could be spent, and better, protecting the Swiss rather than arming others, Viola Amherd did what she could with adequate management, but still paid for problems accumulated over three decades, such as the downsizing of the army, internal discord, and non-Swiss lobbying that led to exorbitant costs in the Department. The Center candidates for her succession are certainly not up to the delicate moment we are living through. Martin Pfister, the favorite, did not shine as a leader during Covid, but seemed more like an executor of orders who never questioned the directives he received, which shows his lack of determination. Markus Ritter, on the other hand, is president of the Swiss Farmers' Union and views everything through the lens of agriculture. His goal will be to ensure maximum benefit for his lobby of supporters, not to solve the problems of the DDPS, and he lacks the competence to manage a crisis.

In contrast, beyond a not insufficient judgment, Mrs. Amherd never addressed the reality behind the Ukrainian crisis and NATO's role, putting Swiss neutrality and prosperity at risk. It is crucial that our citizens know that the EU is a pile of ruins in bankruptcy, with unsolvable problems caused by NGOs, costly migration flows, and the puppets of globalization. It is now moving toward a long-planned war, a solution often used in history to avoid internal problems and reset everything with destruction and conflict: the war the United States is preparing for 2027 against China. The ambiguous union between NATO and the EU, both headquartered in Brussels, bodes nothing good. NATO is a dwindling remnant of the Cold War, clinging to an outdated agenda to control the world, destabilizing entire regions if necessary, through regime changes (like in Ukraine) or illegal wars (Yugoslavia, Iraq, Libya).

The Swiss cannot lend a hand to these geopolitical games, which have done nothing but bring illegal immigrants into the country who have threatened the security of our nation and against whom Jans has not acted: but if it were a woman traveling on a train in the evening, she would have acted differently! The establishment hides these facts, as well as the role of the WHO, from which the United States cleverly withdrew. Right now, we risk being nothing more than a protectorate of organizations like NATO and the EU, and it will take much more than four cows in a barn to get out of it, defending Swiss neutrality. In one week, if elected, I promise concrete actions: I know how to save a lot, up to 60%, in the DDPS, a department that represents a good deal for those who don't pay taxes, where prices are 3 to 10 times higher than normal. Switzerland needs to optimize and defend itself against the threats looming in the geopolitical framework, as well as internally to regain its security.
